# RE: Community Health Promotion in Aboriginal Communities Certificate Program @ VIU

## Greetings!

The Community Health Promotion for Aboriginal Communities (CHPA) program is now entering its third year. One class has graduated and another is very close to completing. We are now looking forward to October 2017 and bringing together a new group of students from across BC and Western Canada to work together through the program.

There are many new opportunities and initiatives included for this next intake. One-time funding has made it possible to not only reduce tuition but introduce improvements to support our students.

## **Program Overview**

Graduates from the CHPA program have the skills to assess community and client health education needs and will be well prepared to work within the community on improving health and wellbeing through health promotion.

- 21 university credits, part time, certificate program;
- Starts October 20, 2017. Ends June 24, 2018;
- Practicum experience is included;
- Short stay seminars in Nanaimo, Cowichan and Quadra Island;
- Tuition reduced by half (\$3,551); includes travel to/from VIU's Nanaimo campus for seminars, accommodation and most meals.

#### Students

Students should be well prepared for learning and participation within classroom and online environments. Short-stay seminars will include additional program activities.
